Liturgist/Reader: This morning we continue with our theme of 'belonging'. On Saturday we noted that in our belonging, we long for wisdom. In our belonging, we also long to be in step with the Spirit. We long to be the people who participate in building the kingdom of God on earth. We long for the fruits of the Spirit to be evident in our lives, our speech, our attitudes, and our actions.

L: That together we come to know the height and the breadth and the depth of the love of Christ;

A: together are built up to the stature of Christ, to the new humanity; together know and bear one another's burdens,

L: therefore fulfilling the law of Christ that we need one another and upbuild one another, admonishing and comforting one another;

A: that we suffer with one another for the sake of righteousness; pray together; together serve God in this world; and together fight against all which may threaten or hinder this unity.

Call to Worship - Liturgist 2:

We praise you, O God; we acclaim you as Lord; All creation worships you, the Father everlasting. To you all angels and all the heavenly powers cry aloud; The cherubim and seraphim sing in endless praise:

ALL: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. [LUYH 541, Te Deum)

Morning Hymn: Holy, Holy, Holy (LUYH 538)

Liturgist 1: This morning in our worship time, we will spend our time in scripture, song, and prayer, expressing our longing for peace, longing for shalom. We worship a holy God who deserves our praise. Yet we know that things are not right in the world. We grieve the brokenness. Listen to these words of confession from Psalm 79.

Psalm of Confession: (Psalm 79:5-9) How long, LORD? Will you be angry forever? How long will your jealousy burn like fire? <sup>6</sup> Pour out your wrath on the nations that do not acknowledge you, on the kingdoms that do not call on your name; <sup>7</sup> for they have devoured Jacob and devastated his homeland.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>8</sup> Do not hold against us the sins of past generations;

may your mercy come quickly to meet us, for we are in desperate need.

9 Help us, God our Savior, for the glory of your name; deliver us and forgive our sins for your name's sake.

Prayer of Confession -liturgist 1 invites the people to join in prayer:

We confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart and mind and strength.

We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.

In your mercy forgive what we have been,
help us amend what we are,
and direct what we shall be,
so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways,
to the glory of your holy name.
Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Song of Confession: Forgive Our Sins as We Forgive (LUYH 638)

Assurance of Pardon (Liturgist 2)

This saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. He bore our sins in his body on the cross, So that free from sins, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds we are healed.

Liturgist 1 - Denise Posie

### Liturgist 1 – Denise Posie

We are going to spend time in prayer, asking for God's healing and restoration in the world and in the Church. You may pray outloud, in silence, on your knees, standing, etc.

Gracious God, we pray your church in North America and around the world. We pray for the CRC and her needs. We pray for the church universal. Hear our prayers for the church....(wait about 60 seconds)

Sing Kyrie – 1X (sing either English or Greek)

# Liturgist 2:

We marvel that the Lord gathers the broken pieces to do his work, and that he blesses us still with joy, new members, and surprising evidences of unity. We commit ourselves to seeking and expressing the oneness of all who follow Jesus.

All: Joining the mission of God, the church is sent with the gospel of the kingdom to call everyone to know and follow Christ and to proclaim to all the assurance that in the name of Jesus there is forgiveness of sin and new life for all who repent and believe.

The Spirit calls all members to embrace God's mission in their neighborhoods and in the world; to feed the hungry, bring water to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, Clothe the naked, care for the sick, and free the prisoner.

We repent of leaving this work to a few, for this mission is central to our being.

Sing: Mighty to Save (everyone needs compassion..., Words & Music by Ben Fielding and Reuben Morgan)

### Liturgist 1

The Great Commission: (Matthew 28:18-20)

Jesus said, "All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me."

With gratitude and expectation we hear Jesus' command:
