The Wild Ride Adventure of CRC Youth Ministry in 2017

When I was a CRC teen, I attended catechism, youth group, "Young Calvinist Convention" and made profession of faith after my final year of high school.

That landscape has certainly changed.

Earlier this year, 55 CRC youth workers from all over the US gathered in Chicago to reflect on the support systems needed for youth ministry today. It was a US-only gathering because CRC churches in Canada already have a support system in place. Participants shared stories and observations, learned about the "Growing Young" approach developed by the Fuller Youth Institute, and explored appointing a Youth Ministry Champion in each classis who would serve to sharpen vision, encourage congregational youth ministry and intergenerational initiatives, and resource churches.

The group agreed that stronger support systems for congregational ministry to teens are needed. Why?
