Introduction

In the Fall of 2019 the leaders at Acton Bethel asked if it was time to re-evaluate what we as a church are called to do.

Is it time for a new "season" of direction and purpose? Are we growing spiritually? Are we being fed? Are we loving God as much as we can? Are we loving each other? Are we loving our community to the fullest?

God prompted us into a process where we felt the need to step back and look at ourselves through the Natural Church Development survey. This exercise brought to light that there were areas we needed to revisit. As a result, we had a successful Visioning Day, with tremendous input. We had an overwhelming turnout and discovered where the Holy Spirit is leading us and we received 122 courageous proposals from the congregation to work with!

Several common themes emerged from these proposals. We realized that we yearn to grow closer to God and to share the Good News. Throughout the Visioning process, we were led to focus on three areas - our love for God, our love for each other and our love for our community.

Although these three areas are distinct, they are interrelated, as are the initiatives described in this document.

From the proposals and the common themes, through discernment and prayer support we were led to 7 initiatives that comprise the *Follow His Light* program.


Now it is time to follow His path and implement these initiatives. A team will be formed to follow-up and carry out these initiatives.
