Important Dates and Schedule of Reporting

The Finance Department of the Christian Reformed Church in North America (CRCNA) is eager to partner with you in your administrative role. We reach out to you several times a year to provide you with updates on your ministry share and church offering gifts. We also provide you with a calendar outlining key dates in the ministry year and suggested dates for offerings.

August 2023

- The Church Administration and Finance Guide booklet is distributed and posted online.
- CRCNA Offering Calendar and deacon's helper worksheets are distributed
- Churches should engage in thoughtful discussions and deliberate on the level of generous support you can pledge to the denominational ministry share program.
- Information regarding the ministry shares pledge process will be mailed to each church.

September 2023

- Classes have conversations about ministry shares at their fall meetings.
- Congregations should submit their pledges between October 2023 and February 2024.

October 2023

- Classes can begin to report pledges to the denomination through the online system.
- Council of Delegates meets October 11-13.

December 2023

- The 2023 Annual Ministry Report is distributed through *The Banner*.
- The denomination begins budget planning for the 2024-2025 fiscal year.

January 2024

• Reminders are sent out to churches who have not yet pledged.

February 2024

- Late or revised pledges should be submitted to the classis and the denomination.
- Council of Delegates meets (virtually) February 14-16.

March 2024

- Late ministry share pledges are accepted and reported to the denomination**
- The denominational ministries budgets are finalized for reporting to the Ministry Boards and the Council of Delegates.

May 2024

- Council of Delegates meets May 3-5.
- Allocation of ministry shares is approved by the Ministry Boards and the COD.
- The denominational budget is reviewed and approved by the Ministry Boards and Council of Delegates.
- * The denomination plans its budget on a July-June fiscal year. Churches may have a different timetable.
- ** New or revised ministry shares pledges are accepted at any time throughout the year.

Ministry Shares Annual Cycle

Pledging Package You'll receive a helpful package by mail to guide your church in determining your annual pledge amount. (Expect this in August!)

Your Fiscal Year While the denomination operates on a fiscal year from June to July, your church may have a different fiscal year. The specific dates are not significant. Just remember to pledge for a 12-month cycle, giving in honor of our covenant relationship.

As a member of the CRCNA, your church's pledge towards denominational ministry shares is crucial for OWERED B budget decisions and supporting our shared ministries. Please ensure your council prioritizes pledging. YOLY SPIRI

Electronic Funds Transfer Options

We are excited to offer you convenient options for your church to send in ministry share contributions. We understand that simplicity and flexibility are important to you, here are two methods available for your consideration:

1. Monthly Transfers

With this approach, you can authorize a fixed dollar amount to be transferred automatically on the 20th day of each month. Your remittance will be distributed to the denominational agencies based on the approved allocation for the year. Additionally, if you have recurring missionary support payments, they can be included and should be identified during setup. Rest assured, you have the flexibility to make changes to the transfer amount at any time to align with your giving goals.

2. One-Time Transfer

If you prefer a one-time remittance, you can authorize a single transfer from your church's account for the desired amount. If we receive your authorization before the 10th of any given month, the transfer will take place on the 20th.

Ministers' Pension

The CRCNA has defined-benefit pension plans for ordained ministers of the Word serving in the United States and Canada. The primary features of the plans include four benefit groups:

- 1. Retirement benefits commencing at age 66, or early retirement benefits in a reduced amount beginning at age 55.
- 2. Long-term disability benefits provided through an insurance company.
- 3. Survivors' benefits paid to a surviving spouse when death of a member occurs while in active service.
- 4. Orphans' benefits paid to a member's orphaned children up to age 18, or to age 21 if in school.

To participate in the Ministers' Pension Plan (MPP), ordained pastors need to complete the MPP registration form and submit it to the pension office.

There are costs associated with participation. Organized churches are expected to pay an amount determined on the basis of a per-member assessment amount multiplied by the number of professing members (or the annual direct cost of participation of their first/only pastor if that amount is greater). In addition, churches pay the direct costs associated with any additional ordained ministers in their employ. Emerging churches must pay the annual direct costs of their ordained pastors, but are not expected to pay based on per member assessments if they do not have an ordained Pastor.

Ministers' Compensation Survey 2023

In the past, detailed surveys were sent to churches and pastors to gather information on base salary, housing, benefits, and other elements for our Ministers Compensation Survey. However, the number of returned surveys decreased over time which affected the reliability of the data. To ensure we provide more accurate and valuable information to churches, we have adopted a new approach.

Starting in 2019, we rely on information received from ministers of the Word who are participants in the Ministers' Pension Plans in the United States and Canada. This group represents the majority of active ministers in the CRCNA. Participants in the pension program are required to report their total base salary and housing or parsonage allowance annually. We have utilized this data to compile the information presented in the following pages.

Why is this new method better? Firstly, the response group is larger, providing more reliable insights. Secondly, using averages of components is more useful than simply summing up compensation. The housing allowance for each minister depends on personal circumstances and local economic factors, which can vary significantly across classes and geographic areas.

What information does the survey include? There are two charts for each country of service. One chart displays the average total salary for ministers in each classis, combining base salary and housing factors. The other chart shows the salary range in relation to percentiles marked at 10% intervals for all ministers in the respective country.

For example, salaries at the 10th percentile are equal to or greater than those of 10% of ministers, and lower than the salaries of 90% of ministers in the country. The 20th percentile represents salaries that are equal to or greater than those of 20% of ministers, and lower than those of 80% of ministers, and so on.


We hope this new approach to the Ministers Compensation Survey provides you with valuable insights and supports your decision-making process regarding minister compensation at both the church and classis level.

Additional Resources

Bridge App

The Bridge App is a mobile application for smartphones and tablets (Apple and Android) that supports the ministry of the local church and the community it serves, in ways that are relational, missional, and local.

Through a core set of functions (Announcements, Events, Pray, Watch, Directory, Give, etc.), The Bridge App seeks to strengthen the bonds of community within a congregation, allowing app users to be more deeply connected to the ministries of their local church. Through additional functions such as Bible, Devotions/Today, Resources and Connected/News, The Bridge App seeks to support the spiritual growth ministry of the local church.

The Bridge App facilitates giving to the local church's ministry by way of the donor self administering their own donations. The Bridge App enables local church members to make one-time or recurring donations via credit card or bank account/debit to the budget and ministries of the local church.

Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR) Program

PAR stands for Pre-Authorized Remittance. PAR is a "direct debit" program that allows people to give through an automatic monthly withdrawal from their bank account. You may already have automatic debits from your bank account to pay for insurance, cable TV, taxes, or your mortgage. If so, then you understand the PAR principle. It means regular contributions throughout the year.

As The Bridge App Give function is self-administered and offers self-directed functionality with more options for participants, we see greater participation of churches in using The Bridge App and churches are encouraged to consider migrating from PAR to the Bridge App.
