## **OUR HISTORY**

In January 1973, as a result of a growing church community at Riverside CRC in Wellandport, a Christian Reformed congregation was formed in the neighbouring community of Smithville. A group of 65 families, including Riverside families, as well as a few families from other surrounding Christian Reformed Churches, began gathering together in the gymnasium of the College Street Public School for Sunday morning worship services. By April of 1973, it was decided to add an afternoon service as well.

The consistory of the Riverside Christian Reformed Church requested Classis Hamilton for permission to institute the Christian Reformed Church of Smithville. At a congregational meeting on July 1, 1973, office bearers were chosen and a new congregation was officially formed.

In September of 1973 a planning committee was appointed to look into purchasing a parcel of land for a new church building. On June 2, 1975 the congregation assembled for a sod turning ceremony. The new church building was dedicated on April 23, 1976.

In the late 1980's and early 1990's after years of modest growth there was a reduction in members as some members left the CRC denomination. By the early 2000's, our congregation began experiencing growth once again, and this trend continued. It was a true blessing to our church community. Throughout our history Smithville CRC has been a church dedicated to biblical teaching, compassionate stewardship and community service.

In September of 2017, after 3 years of planning and fundraising, Smithville CRC celebrated another ground breaking ceremony for our new build. For one year we gathered for Sunday worship next door in the SCHS gymnasium.

In September of 2018 the congregation of Smithville Christian Reformed Church began worship in a new accessible facility, with adequate meeting and worship space for a growing church community. What a blessing.

Sons and Daughters is a Sunday School program offered every Sunday morning. Children Age 3 to Grade 3 are dismissed partway through the service for an age-appropriate Bible lesson, games and activities!



**GEMS | Girls Grades 4 - 8** is a girls' club that meets the first three Wednesday evenings each month from 7 to 8:30 pm (Oct - April). Evenings include Bible study, singing, badge work, crafts, games, and special fun nights and events. It is an opportunity for the girls to

meet in a fun environment and grow together, both socially and spiritually, with loving mentors who help them to understand their value in Christ and what it means to follow Him.

**Sew & Share** is a ministry opportunity for those with a passion for sewing. # **OUR COMMUNITY**

Smithville, Ontario (current population of 4,500) is a small, pleasant community located in the hub of the beautiful Niagara Peninsula.

Founded in 1787 on Twenty Mile Creek by United Empire Loyalists, Smithville has become the commercial and administrative hub of West Lincoln as part of the region of Niagara. A residential area with a commercial centre, it is surrounded by mixed farm land hosting poultry, diary, crops and vineyards.

The Niagara Peninsula lies as a plain between Lake Erie and Lake Ontario and is bordered by the Niagara River which also serves as the Canada/USA border. The Niagara region enjoys all four seasons with moderated summers and winters (27 degrees Celsius to - 7.7 degrees Celsius) and with adequate rainfall. Plant and Wildlife are abundant amongst the local fields and forests.

Within close proximity are St Catharines, Hamilton and Toronto which are easily accessible within a 35 minute drive, as is the US border crossing at Buffalo NY. All provide transportation opportunities such as international airports, passenger rail and highway centres.
