Recommends that churches encourage younger children to make profession of faith.



Agrees to the admission of all baptized children on the basis of their full membership in the covenant community.



Does *not* adopt the change; appoints the Faith Formation Committee.



Children at the Lord's Table Mandate

To deepen the integration of biblical teaching; confessional norms; church polity; and liturgical, educational, and pastoral practices in the CRC with respect to (1) participation in the Lord's Supper, and (2) public profession of faith.



All baptized members who come with ageand ability-appropriate faith in Jesus Christ are welcome to the Lord's Table and called to obey the scriptural commands about participation. . . in an age- and abilityappropriate way, under the supervision of the elders.



Approves committee's recommendation and the proposed church order changes.

Children at the Lord's Table Introducing Change

- Put together a team to plan the process.
- Resolve the issue of profession of faith.
- Establish a process; designate those who are involved with each step.
- Receive the approval of council.
- Designate a Sunday to begin.
- Prepare and educate the congregation.
- Prepare and educate parents.
- Prepare and educate children.
- Welcome children—and celebrate their presence.




Children at the Lord's Table Introducing Change
