Worship:

How are members involved in planning and participation in the liturgy/worship? We have a Worship Committee that meets quarterly and assists the pastor in planning special services and in discussion and implementation of various aspects of worship. We have six organists and planists and also encourage the playing of a variety of instruments during the worship service. Members participate in providing special music, occasional choir numbers, scripture reading, prayer, litanies, children's messages, prayer requests, greeting, and in livestreaming of the services.

Describe the worship services in your church:

Morning (9:30am) worship follows a blended format that encourages a variety of worship styles and participation by all ages. We are currently not having evening services but have been using evening small group studies most of the year.

Describe the discipleship practices in your church for all ages of members and attenders: Sunday School is available for all ages and involves memory work and instruction in the Reformed Faith. We also have an active youth program of GEMS, Cadets, and VBS. In addition, there is a Women's Bible Study (Pray & Work) and a Men's Promise Keeper group, as well as small groups and Care Groups, along with "Bringer Events" that encourage outreach. There has been a renewed effort recently to reach out and attract new members.

The Dispatch CRC campus consists of a brick church building with an attached Fellowship Hall. There is adequate parking and an old schoolhouse on the property that is used for the Cadet program. The campus also includes a playground and a large open field. The church itself includes an AV room (capable of livestream), loft area for meetings, classroom, a three-stop elevator and a chairlift that operates from the ground floor to the sanctuary level. The basement of the church has a nursery, library, consistory room, functional

kitchen, and restroom. The main floor of the large open fellowship hall has a larger kitchen and men's and women's restrooms.

The campus includes a modern brick parsonage with two bedrooms, full bathroom, living room, dining room, kitchen, full laundry room, and study with half bathroom at ground level. The study has a separate entrance. The basement also has two bedrooms, ¾ bathroom, large open area, and storage rooms. There is an attached two-car garage. All large appliances are included. The parsonage has a moderate sized, fenced backyard and plenty of garden space beyond.

The sanctuary has two large-screen TVs to project songs/announcements/etc. The church has full internet capability and a modern sound system. The parsonage has internet and cable TV options.

What has been the most interesting and challenging event in the life of your church in the last three years?

- COVID affect on worship, finances, fellowship, etc, but we were able to begin livestreaming services to continue ministry for all.
- Two consecutive Article 17 Separations (2013 & 2021). These difficult times in the church have recently led us to a period of reflection and self-examination. With the assistance of Interim Pastors, we have held "round table" meetings and established small group studies for healing and encouragement. We dealt with our sins as individuals and a church through a "Day of Atonement" followed by a "Service of Commitment" to each other and the church. We completed a Purpose Statement and Goals/Mission for the church as we move forward.
- We are coming together and showing the willingness to try new things in order to reconcile
 with one another and move forward with God leading the healing. We continue to support
 each other and proceed into our future with prayer, anticipating God's clear leading.

Describe your understanding of the relationship between the local church and the Christian Reformed denomination: The Christian Reformed Denomination is like the parent to the family of local churches. The local church upholds the current CRC beliefs and practices, receives advice and assistance as needed. The local church supports the denomination with prayers, monetary support, and time and provides input. We attend Classis meetings regularly and feel we are able to express our concerns as needed. Although we are isolated from other CRC churches, we feel supported and a part of the larger family of God.

What have been the three most important events in the history of your church?

The First Dutch Christian Reformed Church (Dispatch CRC) of Rotterdam, Jewell County, Kansas was chartered with nineteen members on November 18, 1880. With a long history spanning 142 years, we listed more than three important events.

- One of the most trying times was during WW II when 25 young men left this church and community to serve their country and their God.
- Dispatch CRC has a thriving youth program that began with "The Young People's Society" in the early 1900's. In 1964, the Calvinettes (now GEMS) girls club began, and the Cadets boys club began in 1967. Both GEMS and Cadet groups are thriving ministries with approximately 20 attendees each and most are community children.
- Although not currently functioning, the High School Youth Group attended numerous SERVE projects and this community hosted seven SERVE projects from 1998 – 2018. The hosted SERVEs required cooperation and coordination of local churches and many community volunteers.
- Celebration of our 125th Anniversary in November 2005. Not only a milestone in the history of the church, but this event followed completion of a new addition (Fellowship Hall, kitchen, elevator, etc.) to the church. Dispatch CRC had discussed and even voted (tie vote) on an expansion project, but damage from a 2001 Easter tornado required the church to come together to repair the parsonage and garage and to plan and construct the new addition that now serves us so well.
- Two consecutive Article 17 Separations in 2013 and 2021. But we trust in God's plan and look to a blessed future.



Dispatch Christian Reformed Church of rural Cawker City, Kansas is seeking a full-time pastor to lead our congregation in carrying out our ministry in a rural county area of North Central Kansas. We have been praying for a man to come alongside us as we move forward from a difficult period in recent years to a vibrant renewed ministry of faith, growth and fellowship within the church and our community.

Throughout Dispatch's 142-year history, God has faithfully cared for our members and we have shown each other and the community that He is the Rock that our foundation is set on.

Experience and Qualifications:

- No experience required but must be ordained or willing to become ordained as a Minister of the Word and/or Commissioned Pastor in the Christian Reformed Church.
- We are seeking a Spirit-equipped servant-leader who is committed to the Reformed faith.
- Who relates well with the young and older generations of our congregation.
- Teaches the truths of the Bible and lives them out daily. Messages will be biblically based and applicable to members daily lives.
- He will work alongside and support the church in carrying out our vision and purpose: "Believe, Glorify, and Disciple".
- Will communicate clearly with church members and the Council.
- Will lead and encourage the church to show the love of Christ within our community to meet their spiritual, emotional and physical needs.

Job Duties/Responsibilities:

The calling of a minister of the Word is to proclaim, explain, and apply Holy Scripture in order to gather in and build up the members of the church of Jesus. (C.O. Article 11)

- Preaching the Word of God. Conduct Public Worship Services includes Explaining the Word of God and Teaching the Creeds and Confessions
 - We currently hold morning service at 9:30am and have been using small group studies in the evening.
- Pastoral care and visiting Includes counsel to the distressed and those with problems (or refer them to appropriate centers for assistance). He will visit those in the hospital, the shut-ins and the widowed. He will participate in home visits, offer comfort to the grieving and conduct funerals as requested or under the advisement of the elders. He will require

pre-marital counseling and conduct weddings under the discretion of the elders. He will encourage the members to live by faith, comfort them in adversity, and warn them against errors in doctrine and life.

- Administer the Sacraments (Baptism and Holy Communion)
- Education The pastor shall help members develop their spiritual gifts and identify areas in which they can be used.
 - Catechize the Youth The pastor, with the assistance of the elders, will oversee the instruction of the youth.
 - The pastor will take responsibility to guide baptized and new members to make profession of faith.
 - Train Members for Christian Service
- The pastor shall encourage and help equip members for Christian service
- Participate in supervision and discipline
- Evangelism
- Committees The minister shall normally serve on the Outreach Committee, the Worship Committee, and the Education Committee. He is welcome to attend any other committee meeting of the church
