
Churches have language, liturgy, staff and practices that help members connect to God. What language, liturgy, staff and practices do churches have to connect to and deeply love their neighbors?

For a church to become known as a church that cares and gives life to a community, consider the following practices:

- Imagining and creating ways to convene and connect neighbors so they get to know each other and care about each other.
- Discover the gifts in your neighborhood (gifts of knowledge, skills, resources) and discover new ways to encourage gift exchanges in the neighborhood.
- Discovering, through listening (one to one conversations, small groups, input) what residents care about enough to work on it with us.
- Organizing community action groups around the things residents care about.
- Celebrating community accomplishments and milestones.
- Convene a neighborhood dreaming, strategic planning process.




