Growing Young

A few months into my second year as Youth Champion, I continue to focus on providing what was so valuable to me as a new youth leader. I was introduced to this denominational network at a time when I was in need of resources and connections to others who were navigating youth ministry. Time spent with these individuals lead to new resources, wisdom, and people to follow up with when I found myself wondering what to do next.

Our expanding network within the classis includes paid youth leaders, volunteers, pastors, classis leadership, and lay people from our congregations who have a heart for the youth of the church. As I continue to hear their stories and learn about the strengths and struggles of their individual ministries, I've been able to connect them to resources and to each other. I'm not always the one with the best answers, but I can identify where the answers are and help make those connections.

Two of my focuses have been promoting intergenerational activities and supporting families in their ministry to their children. The old "it takes a village" mentality has been supported by church-based research in building a lasting faith in our young people. It's not something we're likely to dispute, but it may take an intentional shift in the way we seek to grow in faith together.

A few years ago, I was introduced to the book *Growing Young*. It included two things I was actively looking for at the time: suggestions for understanding teenagers and help finding ways to engage them in the church. Recently I had an opportunity to train on this material with the Fuller Youth Institute as members of our Youth Champions network prepare to serve as coaches on this *Growing Young* mindset. I have come to realize that the things young people need to grow and feel engaged in the life of the church are much the same thing we're *all* in need of. I'm excited now for the opportunity to walk with others who are seeking an increased vitality in their church life across the generations.

This *Growing Young* mentality is not about relinguishing the keys to our churches to the next generation, but it does include a willingness to share meaningful responsibility with potential future leaders. We also need to work to understand the younger generation, a practice I've found to be critical with our older members as well. And doesn't our community grow stronger when we take an interest in each other's lives? If we grow to know each other better, focus our ministry on the life and words of Jesus, create warm community, and make it a priority to support our families, a new generation of the church rises up and we are better equipped to meet the needs of our full membership and the communities we live and worship in.
