The grand narrative of God the Father, Jesus the sacrificed Son, and the Holy Spirit, our Comforter, is the story we are called to share! And we in youth ministry are privileged to engage on the front lines of this calling because we love the local church and long for young people to understand the stories of Creation, Fall, and Redemption so that God's story becomes their story.

This year, Youth Unlimited celebrates 100 years of doing ministry alongside the Christian Reformed Church. The YU staff have been poring over a 100 years of youth ministry stories that illustrate where God has gone out ahead of us to redeem a chaotic, complex world. This year, 23 communities around North America hosted SERVE mission trips (youthunlimited.org/serve). About 1400 participants lived out the big story of Grace, Love, and Truth—the story of an innocent child born of a virgin, grown to be a perfect human of divine calling, hung to die, and resurrected to new life.

We praise God that our youth willingly share the God story through actions and words in a variety of ways!
