Chichibu, a city in Japan known for its many Buddhist temples and Shinto shrines, has only a small Christian population. Yet, with support from Resonate Global Mission, local leaders like Mrs. Chieko Ishii are faithfully sharing the gospel and nurturing spiritual growth in this community.

Chieko grew up attending the Chichibu Church, which was planted many years ago with the help of Resonate missionaries. The church became a place of cherished memories for her.

However, as she grew older and life became busier, Chieko drifted away from both the church and her faith. She sought fulfillment in various areas of her life, but always felt something was missing.

Initially seeking quick wealth through gambling, Csaba found himself overwhelmed by debt and struggling with addiction. In search of a new path, he discovered the Ózd Therapy Center, a Resonate Global Mission partner.

Situated in a serene village, the Ózd Therapy Center offers a haven for those battling alcohol, drug, and gambling addictions. For three decades, the center has provided support, care, and spiritual guidance, helping individuals like Csaba find a new direction in life.

Csaba entered the intensive six-month program with a mix of skepticism and hope. He engaged in daily chores on the working farm, from gardening to cooking, and participated in the center's communal meals, where prayers and fellowship offered a sense of belonging. ADAPTIVE LEADERSHIP

EXPANDING HEARTS EXCHANGED

"What does it mean to live out the gospel?" This question was one that Helen often wrestled with. When she joined the Hearts Exchanged program, she wasn't sure what to expect, but she was eager to learn how the church was engaging in the important work of truth and reconciliation with Indigenous communities.

Over the course of this 8-month learning journey, Helen took part in activities and talking circles designed to foster meaningful dialogue and inspire action to begin healing the broken relationships between Indigenous peoples and Reformed Christians.

Since its launch in 2020, Hearts Exchanged has already seen 42 cohorts and over 500 participants from across Canada. Building on the momentum of the past five years, the program is now expanding with Hearts Exchanged: Communities of Practice—a new initiative that provides ongoing support and resources to help congregations implement local reconciliation plans.

Through Hearts Exchanged, church communities are learning what it means to live out the gospel by engaging with Indigenous neighbours and fellow image-bearers in the critical work of reconciliation. As Helen shared, "**This hasn't been easy, but it is necessary.**" Thank you for your support in sustaining and expanding this vital, transformative work.

GROWING IN JUSTICE

Addressing justice is never simple. It's a delicate balance between confronting systemic issues and meeting the immediate needs of communities. For many Christians, the desire to respond biblically to injustice can leave them seeking practical, faith-based guidance. This is where the Centre for Public Dialogue steps in, offering workshops that help individuals navigate these complex issues with a solid biblical foundation.

One such workshop, Faith in Action, explores how the Bible envisions communities of peace, justice, and faithful action. Cindy Stover, the workshop facilitator, shares her vision: "Participants will not only be grounded in a biblical understanding of what it means to do justice, but they will also become more aware of the resources and strengths they already have to address injustice when it impacts them and their neighbors."

The Faith in Action workshop covers vital topics such as the root causes of injustice, the role of advocacy, and the healing required after injustice. It equips participants with practical, actionable steps to pursue justice in their local contexts. Whether in person or online, this workshop meets people where they are, helping them apply their learning to real-world situations.

Peter Carrión's story beautifully illustrates the power of intercultural ministry. Originally from Ecuador, Peter found that he was missing the opportunity to worship in his native language of Spanish. This led Peter to begin hosting services in his home, which eventually grew into La Roca Spanish Ministry. As the ministry expanded, the need for a larger space led to a partnership with Immanuel CRC in Brampton, Ontario. Peter and the La Roca community are part of a broader vision to build vibrant, multicultural church communities across Canada.

Peter and other church leaders are currently participating in a 10-month collaborative initiative aimed at exploring what it means to be a healthy, multicultural church. This unique program brings together 13 Canadian congregations from diverse ethnic and cultural backgrounds to share insights, deepen their understanding, and develop innovative practices for fostering multicultural hospitality and community.

As Canada's demographic landscape continues to evolve—with projections indicating that by 2044, half of the population will be Indigenous, Black, or a person of colour—churches are increasingly seeking ways to embrace and reflect this diversity in ways that are faithful to the Gospel. The learning cohort is focused on equipping leaders with the tools and strategies needed to navigate the complexities of multiculturalism.
