Our History

Recently celebrating its 55th anniversary, Bethel Church originated as Aldershot Christian Reformed Church in September 1969, emerging from the fruitful congregations of Dundas CRC, First Hamilton CRC, and Burlington CRC. From the very beginning, Bethel was a welcoming and vibrant community, initially meeting at a local school. Early ministries found homes in church basements, borrowed facilities, and even outdoor services during the summer months.

Bethel Church has a rich history of hospitality, beginning with its tradition of warmly greeting worshippers at the door and coffee gatherings after worship. Over the years, the church has nurtured connections among its members through regular gatherings, while also implementing community outreach programs such as Vacation Bible School, the Community Garden, Alpha, and many other initiatives. This dedication to building relationships and serving others has been a cornerstone of Bethel's mission from its inception.

Our History

In 1974, the land for the church building was generously donated, envisioning a new place of worship at the corner of Kern's Road and Highway 5. Construction of the church began in 1977, featuring a design that resembles a tent pitched on a hilltop, with hands lifted in prayer. In 2000, an addition was made to the church to accommodate a growing congregation, with further renovations occurring in 2012 to update our space.

Sadly, Bethel has had a history of conflict and tension which has not always been handled well. In the past 20 years, there have been multiple reasons for this conflict, including tensions with the Pastor, the COVID-19 pandemic, the Human Sexuality Report, and others, which have led to a decline in membership.

In 2022, Bethel completed a Crossroads Discernment Process with Resonate Global Missions to help reflect on what God has done in our past and what he is doing in the present in order to discern what God is calling us towards in the future. This process gave new hope and has helped to identify future ways we can bless each other and our community.

In 2023, two significant things happened; first, Bethel invited Pastor Derek as a Specialized Transitional Minister to continue in the process of rejuvenating the church. In addition, the closure of New Street CRC after seven decades of ministry led to new members joining Bethel, further enriching the church's community. Through the years, Bethel Church has remained committed to its mission of connection, outreach, and nurturing faith, celebrating a rich history while looking forward to the future.

Fellowship and Outreach: Bethel's Ministries

Sunday School: A lively program for children aged 3 to grade 4, with attendance of apx. 5-10 children weekly, offering engaging Bible lessons that lay the foundation for their faith journey.

GEMS and Cadets: Clubs for girls and boys that meet weekly with attendance of apx. 25 children, providing a mix of Bible study and fun activities to encourage friendships and introduce them to the basics of Christian faith.

Coffee Break: A welcoming weekly social group for women, creating a space for connection, conversation, support, and Bible study, with weekly attendance of about 25 women.

Small Groups: Intentional gatherings designed for members to come together, study the Bible, and engage in meaningful discussions that strengthen relationships. Currently there are 8 small groups meeting from Bethel members.

Bethel Community Garden: An outreach initiative that fosters connections with the greater community while celebrating the beauty of God's creation and promoting stewardship through Bethel's 40 garden plots.

Vacation Bible School (VBS): A week-long summer outreach program filled with fun activities and engaging lessons aimed at introducing children to the love of Jesus, with attendance of about 50 children from Bethel and the community.

Youth Group: Bethel is working to restart our youth program as a monthly social gathering with the hope to grow it into something more.




Bethel CRC is starting to feel like a home church.


