

Ministers' Pension Plan Assessments

The CRCNA offers a defined benefit pension plan for ordained clergy serving in the United States and Canada. While the primary purpose of the plans is to provide retirement benefits, the plans also provide significant survivor and orphan benefits as well as long-term disability protection for active participants. The Ministers' Pension Plan is funded through assessments. All per member assessment and direct cost amounts for 2020 remain the same as 2019.

- Organized churches are required to pay assessments determined at an amount per active professing member age 18 and older, or, if greater, the direct cost of their "first or only" pastor's participation in the Plan. The number of members is the net member count submitted on the annual Yearbook Questionnaire.
- Pension costs associated with any additional ordained ministers employed by organized churches and for all ordained ministers in the employ of emerging churches are annually determined direct cost amounts.
- The annual direct cost amounts in 2020 are \$7,704 (or \$642 per month) in the United States and \$9,840 (or \$820 per month) in Canada.
- The annual per-member assessment amounts in 2020 are \$37.20 (or \$3.10 per month) in the U.S. and \$42.96 (or \$3.58 per month) in Canada.
- All pension related amounts are billed the first day of the month with payment due by the 20th of each month.
- Organized churches that are vacant (currently without a pastor) are expected to continue to support the pension fund with the per-member assessment amount as this is a communal commitment that assists in funding the pension benefits for retired pastors.
