CHURCH LIFE

At its core, Bethel Church displays the many connected, supportive, and generous families that make up the congregation. Bethel prides itself in being a caring, prayerful, and ministry-minded congregation. At Bethel, members love celebrating together. The family of Bethel supports one another during times of sorrow by sharing a listening ear, words of encouragement, prayer, preparation of food, and written cards. The members have a strong giving mentality and support both ministries within the church, and our local and global ministries. We strive to be a covenant community that worships, grows, and serves best when we do it together.

Our church believes that part of being a disciple of Jesus means worshiping the God who redeems us and calls us by name. Bethel Church strives for God-centered, Biblically sound, and inspirational worship. We combine faith-forming traditional hymns with Scripture-inspired praise songs. Bethel Church worships together on Sunday mornings which allows the disciples of Jesus to experience the presence of the Living God. Each Sunday, many congregation members use their gifts to worship God. Participants are seen or heard playing an instrument, singing with the praise team or choir, reading a litany, assisting in the sound booth or tech room, singing in the congregation, working as building security, greeting members and visitors, and aiding in children's ministries.

Being a disciple of Jesus is never over. The church encourages each believer to continue to learn and grow as followers of Christ. Members and visitors alike have opportunities to get involved in a variety of ministries to help them continue growing and encouraging the development of their spiritual gifts. Bethel offers opportunities for continued growth for members of all ages.

We plant the seed and expose our children to the love of Jesus at a young age. Children's love for Jesus is nurtured through a variety of programs including Bethel Kids for toddlers through first grade, Sunday school for second grade through sixth grade, Oasis for junior high and high schoolers, GEMS girls club, and Cadets boys club.

Bethel offers its adult opportunities to grow through programs like adult education classes, Bible studies, and other small groups focused on studying the Word. These, and other opportunities, help the family of Bethel to continue to grow in their knowledge and walk with God.

When it comes to serving together at Bethel, we look to the ultimate example of a servant, Jesus. Jesus came as a humble and sacrificial servant. His act of service was bringing broken humanity the good news. Being a disciple of Jesus involves sharing this good news through both word and deed. Our congregation joins to serve both local and global ministries as well as missionaries. Bethel Church is in Lansing, Illinois, a community about 25 miles south of Chicago Loop and within Cook County Illinois which also borders Indiana to the east. According to a 2020 census, Lansing's population comes to 26,700 residents and is the 79th largest city in Illinois and covers about 7.5 square miles. Lansing was established in 1893 and was originally made up of Dutch and German settlers but has become a diverse community. Lansing is currently declining at a rate of -0.79% annually.

Bethel Church

Our members come from about a 10–12-mile radius from South Holland, Illinois to Crown Point, Indiana. Approximately 43% live in Illinois while 57% live in Indiana. Nearly half of our members drive 10-20 minutes to church. Many of our members come from surrounding Illinois towns such as Lynwood, South Holland, and Calumet City as well as Indiana towns including Munster, Highland, Dyer, Schererville, St. John, Cedar Lake, and Crown Point. We have strong church support of and for our local Christian Schools with children attending four grammar schools, Lansing Christian, Calvin Christian, Crown Point Christian, and Highland Christian schools and our high school, Illiana Christian High School.



Bethel Church was built in 1992 with an addition completed in spring of 2002. The property consists of 12.8 acres with a 49,500 sq. ft building. It has over 35 classrooms and meetings rooms, a Family Life Center which can seat 250 people for all sorts of events, a seminar room that is a little more formal, 2 courtyards, and an office suite. The sanctuary can seat 900 people.









CHURCH HISTORY









Bethel Church was formed in 1958 due to crowded conditions in the Lansing Christian Reformed Churches of Oak Glen and First Lansing, and the Munster Christian Reformed Church in Munster, Indiana. The first worship service was held on March 16, 1958 in the chapel of Illiana Christian High School which, at the time, was also in Lansing. The new church was officially organized on June 9, 1958, with a charter membership of 73 families and nine individuals. The first pastor was called in 1959. A parsonage was purchased and construction began on the first church building on 186th Street. This building was dedicated in 1961 with 92 families making up the membership. Bethel's passion for educating the youth and participation in missions originated here.

From the beginning Bethel experienced growth. Within the first 10 years Bethel almost doubled in size. Since the congregation was young, in ministry years and members' ages, internal growth caused Bethel to outgrow the sanctuary and a 200-seat addition was added in 1977. Soon after, two morning services were held to accommodate the members. Continued growth pointed to the need for an additional pastor. In the late 1980s, the position of associate pastor was created and team ministry began.

This continued until 1990 when another congregation offered to buy the 186th Street property. Seeing an opportunity to continue to grow, Bethel purchased new acreage three miles away on Glenwood-Lansing Road. While the new building was under construction, worship services were held at Lansing's public high school and Lynwood Christian Reformed Church. This continued for two years and proved to be a challenging period for Bethel. Dedicated members came together and donated time, energy, expertise, goods, and money to build the new church. The outpouring of gifts resulted in a building dedicated to God's glory, and a worship home for 265 families, nearly 1,060 members.

Additional paid positions were added to reflect this growth and to take advantage of the new facility including a director of youth education, a music coordinator, a children's ministry director, and a technical director. The facility was also experiencing overcrowding and an expansion was approved for large meeting rooms, classrooms, seminar room, office suite, and extended family life center in 2001.

Shortly after this expansion, families started moving south and east into Indiana. As a result, families, particularly young families, began transferring to other churches closer to their homes with more contemporary worship styles. Bethel began to evaluate the traditional worship style and it was decided to change to a more blended style of worship. This resulted in a mild contemporary mix of praise songs and traditional psalms and hymns. More people became involved in worship serving the Lord with praise teams and instruments.

Today Bethel Church continues to experience change as Lansing and the surrounding communities change, and families continue to move to Indiana and transfer to congregations closer to their homes. As a result of these changes, Bethel has decided to maintain two full time pastors with Pastor Shaun Buikema serving as the Lead Pastor focused on worship and youth ministries and is seeking an Executive Pastor to focus on administration, adult ministries, evangelism and missions.

Bethel started small, grew to be very large, and now holds worship services on Sunday for about 250 a week. Through all the changes, God's blessings are evident. Bethel continues to be a caring, generous, mission-minded, singing, and praying church, where God's word is preached faithfully.
