## Gathering

(Please rise in body or in spirit)

Call to Worship

Leader: We have been appointed by God to give voice to the constant praise of every

creature under heaven.

*People:* Let us raise a song of praise and thanksgiving to God.

People sing: "O Worship the King" Lift Up Your Hearts 2


(Please be seated) Confession and Assurance

Leader: Made in God's image, we are called to be grateful caretakers of God's creation, tending it with love and care. But we have rebelled against our Maker. We have lived as if the creation belongs to us, becoming estranged from God, from the creation, and from one another. Let us confess our sins to the Lord.

People: Creator God, you made us rulers in your creation, placing its care and wellbeing in our hands. But we have betrayed your trust. Desiring control, we recklessly exploit its resources, and make idols of the things we produce from it. In your great love, forgive us, O God, and remake us in the image of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

We remember our baptism as the water is poured.

Leader: People of God, put your faith in Jesus Christ. He is the true image of the invisible God. Through his death on the cross he paid for our sins. By his resurrection he restored us to our human dignity. In his ascension he promises a new creation. Thanks be to God!



Leader:


Leader:

Old Testament Reading: Jeremiah 8:18 - 9:1

Leader: <sup>18</sup>My joy is gone, grief is upon me, my heart is sick. <sup>19</sup>Hark, the cry of my poor

people from far and wide in the land:

*People:* "Is the Lord not in Zion? Is her King not in her?"

Leader: "Why have they provoked me to anger with their images, with their foreign

idols?"

*People:* 20"The harvest is past, the summer is ended, and we are not saved."

Leader: <sup>21</sup>For the hurt of my poor people I am hurt, I mourn, and dismay has taken hold of me. <sup>22</sup>Is there no balm in Gilead? Is there no physician there? Why then has

New Testament Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-7

Leader:

<sup>1</sup>First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, <sup>2</sup>for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. <sup>3</sup>This is right and is acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, <sup>4</sup>who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. <sup>5</sup>For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human, <sup>6</sup>who gave himself a ransom for all—this was attested at the right time. <sup>7</sup>For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.



For the calling of stay-at-home parents -

Ashes: for the times we forget that our children are image bearers of God and are individuals with their own personalities, not extensions of their parents. For the times we worry more about other people's opinions of our children than about nurturing their souls

Affirmation of Faith

Leader: Let us together affirm our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed.

*People:* We believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things, visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, begotten from the Father before all ages, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made; of the same essence as the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven; he became incarnate by the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and was made human. He was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried. The third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures. He ascended to heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again with glory to judge the living and the dead. His kingdom will never end.

And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, and who spoke through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church. We affirm one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and to life in the world to come. Amen.

Preparing the Table

Leader:

... to God the Father


Leader:

Creator God, by your power and love all things came to be: the vast expanse of space with its swirling galaxies, blazing stars, spinning planets, and this teeming earth, our island home. From these primal elements you brought forth the human race, made in your image and appointed as stewards of the earth. Though we betrayed your trust and turned against you, still you called us, again and again, to

return, and revealed your righteous Law. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your own Son, born of a woman, to reconcile us to you by his own blood and restore us to our true humanity.

We give thanks to God that our Savior Jesus Christ, through whom and for whom all things were made, gave us this memorial of his sacrifice until his coming again. On the night he was betrayed he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

People: We who are many are one body for we all share the same loaf.

Leader: After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, "Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

The cup which we all share is our fellowship in the blood of Christ.

*Leader:* Remembering God's faithfulness to us and to all of creation through Jesus Christ, let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Leader.

Lord God of all creation, through your goodness we have received this bread and wine: fruit of the earth and work of human hands. By your Holy Spirit, may it become for us the bread of life and the cup of salvation. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: For by him and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit we offer you this, our sacrifice of praise, Almighty Father, now and forever.

People: Amen.

Leader: And now as our Savior taught us we are bold to pray:

*People:* Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us

our debts, as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

The Invitation to the Table

Leader:

Congregation in the Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord has prepared this table for all who love and trust in him for their salvation. Anyone baptized in the name of the Triune God is now invited to come with gladness to this holy meal. The gifts of God for the people of God.

Process forward using the center aisles, joining the communion circle at the front of the church. Anyone baptized in the name of the Triune God is invited to participate in this holy meal. If you are not baptized and would like to learn more about becoming baptized, you are invited to speak with a staff member or an elder after the service. Children may join their parents in the communion circle; for a spoken blessing, children should stand in front of their parents.

The bread and cup are passed around the circle. When you receive the bread, break a small piece and pass it along to the next person saying, "the body of Christ for you." Then dip the bread into the cup and pass it to the next person with the words, "the blood of Christ poured out for you." A server will come around the circle with gluten-free bread for those with allergies. Wine will be served in the first 3 circles. Grape juice will be served in all subsequent circles. After everyone in the circle has received the elements, recess down the outside aisles.

Someone is available to pray with you on either side of the sanctuary.




