Part 3: Leadership Expectations

The top 7 leadership categories which Hope church feels are the most important qualities of a pastor.

- Effective preacher/speaker of the gospel truth
- Helps people develop their personal relationship with God
- Effectively works with and connects with the youth
- Makes pastoral calls to people confined in their homes or in the hospital
- Encourages members to relate their faith to their daily lives

Part 4: Church History

Sixty years ago in Hull, Iowa, 24 families, including the minister and entire consistory, withdrew their memberships from the Protestant Reformed Church. Their denomination's view of God's grace had caused years of controversy. Locally, the dispute had led to intense division in families and rifts among friends with resulting ramifications that remain today.

But, motivated by faith, hope, love and a desire for peace, the dissenting group reunited with the Christian Reformed denomination and envisioned a ministry that would touch not only the lives of their own members but also the life of their community.

The new congregation was named HOPE:

"For you are our Hope, oh Lord God." Psalm 71:5

"To lay hold of the Hope set before us" Hebrews 6:18

Second, third and fourth generations of those original founders are among its current members. "That is why we labor and strive, because we have put our HOPE in the living God." 1 Timothy 4:10

A church building was completed in 1965 and has had several additions and renovations to accommodate the growing church membership needs as well as community activities.

A parsonage was also built and has been the home of 10 pastors. Their individual stories can be found in the 50 year anniversary book.

The history of Hope throughout its six decades shows how it has faithfully carried out its mission to offer spiritual growth opportunities to all of its members:

- With worship services twice each Sunday and on special occasions
- Offering opportunities for using a variety of musical talents
- With Bible studies for men, for women, for couples
- With Sunday School, children and worship, catechism and Youth Group

Hope provides Hearts and Hands Care Groups for its members to encourage each other in times of special needs, to enjoy each other in fellowship, and to provide special hands-on services when needed.

And the history of Hope shows how it continues to touch the lives of the Hull community:

In the 80's Hope Church began the "Coffee Break" meetings for all ladies in the community of Hull and continues to host the Wednesday morning lessons for women of all ages, with nursery and toddler groups to teach and entertain their small children. (COVID-19 has momentarily interrupted this, of course.) Cadets and Gems have also often made use of Hope's accommodations and hospitality.

Hope furnishes representatives for the Hull Daily Vacation Bible School, the after-school community services, Meals on Wheels, Combined Appeal, the American Legion and Auxiliary, the Bible League, Gideons, Love in the Name of Christ (LOVE Inc), Samaritan's Purse, Christmas gifts, and Friendship Bible Studies for those with special needs.

Hope combines with other churches in town for special services such as on Memorial Day, for community holiday activities and sports activities and with groups for assisting newcomers and those with language barriers.

Hope has volunteers on the various city support crews as firefighters, rescue units, business associations, etc.

Hope provides board members and countless other volunteers for Hull Christian Grade School and Western Christian High School.

Hope supports worldwide missions in Mississippi, Denver, South Africa, Spain, and Guatemala.
