Who we are

Our History

With very humble beginnings, Maranatha Christian Reformed Church has been worshipping and serving God in Woodstock, Ontario for over 70 years.

After World War II, a large number of Dutch immigrants moved to Canada with many settling in the Woodstock area to farm. Several of these families gathered on Sundays in their various homes to worship together. As the group grew, they began to talk about organizing and becoming a church, and on May 29, 1949, the Christian Reformed Church in Woodstock-Ingersoll was officially formed. As their numbers continued to increase, it was evident that a worship space was needed, and so, by God's Grace and with limited funds they began building the basement portion of what would be their new church.

The following years were years of growth and building. In 1953, 24 families from the neighbouring town of Ingersoll, left to form a church closer to their homes. The remaining 100 families then became First Christian Reformed Church of Woodstock. In 1954, a new building project was begun along the future 401 highway. During this time, the church also took on the building of a Christian school. In 1973, 40 families left to form the Second Christian Reformed Church of Woodstock but in 1977, it was decided that these two congregations would instead divide themselves geographically to serve the north end (Covenant CRC) and south end (Maranatha CRC) of Woodstock.

In August 1979, a tornado struck Woodstock and destroyed both Maranatha's church building and the Christian school. Knox Presbyterian Church of Woodstock graciously shared their facilities with us following the tornado until we could rebuild. Exactly one year later, the cornerstone of Maranatha's new building was placed in the front wall and the dedication service took place in November 1980.

God has continued to bless us and we outgrew the facility along the 401. With changes to our ministries and the limited versatility of our existing facilities, we decided to relocate and build a new facility in 2009. This move took us out of the increasingly commercialized area near the 401 and into a developing neighbourhood where we could better reach out and serve in our community. We started ministry in the new facility in May 2010 and with the Lord's blessing continues to be our home.

Our Community

Woodstock is a small city (population ~40,000) surrounded by rural counties and smaller towns. Its location along the 401 corridor (Canada's largest and busiest highway) makes it a popular area to live for commuters. Driving 45 minutes in either direction leads you to three larger cities (London, Hamilton, and Kitchener/Waterloo). Woodstock has expanded beyond its rural roots in recent years, becoming a hub for some major industries and factories. Combined with the existing thriving agricultural community, many residents also find employment locally. There is also a growing number of entrepreneurial businesses. Maranatha's facilities are situated in the suburbs of Woodstock.

Membership and Demographics

The City of Woodstock has not traditionally been very multi-cultural and Maranatha generally reflects this composition. In recent years, Woodstock has seen substantial growth and is quickly becoming a more culturally diverse community. Likewise, even though our congregation still largely reflects its Dutch roots, we are beginning to see a broader diversity within our membership.






Demographics

How did Christ set this mission upon us?

Our mission statement of "Finding Joy in Following Jesus" speaks to both our gift (joy in Jesus) and our task (following Him).

- It inspires us to consider what joy we have found in Christ and to share it.
- It challenges us to move toward deeper joy in our walk with God.
- It clearly communicates to our neighbours Maranatha's purpose.
- It is solidly biblical. Jesus said "I have told you this..." (about living in the Father's love for us) "so that my joy may be in you and that your joy might be complete." (John 15:11)
- It is deeply reformed. Our catechism asks: What is the coming-to-life of the new self? The answer: "Wholehearted joy in God through Christ and a love and delight to live according to the will of God by doing every kind of good work." (Lord's Day 33, Q&A 90)

Our continued prayer for Maranatha is that in all of our lives, we experience the deep comfort of God's presence and love – for growth, unity and the fullness of Jesus' joy in us.


The Director of Worship and Music does the majority of planning and preparation for each service, in collaboration with the pastor and with the Worship Advisory Team. Maranatha follows a traditional order of worship each week with a blend of traditional music/hymns as well as more contemporary style music. Under the direction of the Worship Coordinator, a praise team leads the singing and spoken parts of the liturgy and is accompanied by various instruments. Throughout the year, our congregation looks forward to special services that are planned and led by some of our ministries such as GEMS, Cadets and Friendship just to name a few. We enjoy and seek out multi-generational participation in our services.

Outreach


- Cadets hosts an annual road hockey tournament that draws in participants from the community each year

- Building a relationship with the mayor of Woodstock who will attend special church events




Leadership

Presently, we have 22 council members serving 3-year terms. Full council meets 6-7 times per year.



Challenges and opportunities in living out our mission
