Members are involved to a large extent with worship planning by committees such as Prayer and Worship Committee, Banner Committee and Council. Members also participate in worship by way of scripture reading, musical accompaniment and leading the Children's message. There is also special group and seasonal participation by the Sunday School, Cadets and GEMS programs.

Currently there is one worship service held every Sunday at 10am. Worship services mostly follow traditional CRC worship style with a mix of different styles of music, liturgies, etc. Open to innovation.

Sunday School:

- -Runs from September through June
- -Meets every Sunday during worship service
- -From ages 3 through to Grade 6
- -Current attendance 25 children
- -8 Sunday School teachers

Cadets:

- -Runs from September through June
- -Meets every Monday evening 7-8:30pm
- -Boys from Grades 2 through 8
- -Current attendance is 15 boys
- -3 Cadet counselors and 1 junior counselor

GEMS:

- -Runs from September through June
- -Meets every Monday evening 7-8:30pm
- -Girls from Grades 2 through 8
- -Current attendance is 20 girls
- -4 GEMS counselors

Mom's Group:

- -Meets every Wednesday
- -Average attendance is 5 moms and 10 children
