

## Readington Reformed Church – Overview Summary

Readington Reformed Church (RRC) is currently seeking a part-time pastor who will walk alongside a warm, close-knit congregation with spiritual maturity, compassion, and a collaborative spirit. With an average Sunday attendance of 35–40 people and an annual budget of \$152,000, RRC offers a stable foundation supported by dedicated leaders, strong lay involvement, and a genuine desire to grow in faith and mission. The church values its historic identity while eagerly exploring new ways to engage families, strengthen outreach, and deepen its presence in the community.

Readington Reformed Church (RRC) is a historic, deeply rooted congregation in the Reformed Church in America, worshipping in a traditional and reverent style that reflects its long heritage. Services follow the classic RCA liturgy of approaching God, receiving God's Word, and responding in faith. The church's 1864 sanctuary sits amid flowing creeks, deer-filled fields, and the rolling farmland of Readington Township, creating a peaceful and inspiring setting for worship and community life.

RRC is a warm, close-knit congregation known for its hospitality, spiritual depth, and genuine care for one another. The congregation currently includes approximately 35 active members, with an average weekly worship attendance of 25. Members describe the church as a family—supportive, welcoming, and grounded in faith.

A recent highlight was a series of spiritual journey discussion groups led by Rev. Fretz, where congregants shared stories, hopes, and faith experiences. These conversations strengthened relationships and deepened the congregation's sense of shared purpose.

The church offers several ongoing opportunities for spiritual growth, including weekly Bible studies, women's ministry events, seasonal conferences, and a men's breakfast study. While the Sunday School program has declined due to demographic shifts, the congregation recognizes the importance of rebuilding ministries that engage younger families and children.

RRC is active in cooperative ministry with neighboring Reformed churches, participating in shared Bible studies, Lenten programs, mission partnerships, and community worship services. The church also engages in the broader community through concerts, mission projects, and hosting local organizations. Looking

ahead, RRC hopes to expand its outreach by partnering with the township on community events and by hosting more public gatherings that invite neighbors into the life of the church.

Surrounded by quiet country roads, open farmland, and the natural beauty of rural New Jersey, Readington Reformed Church is a place of peace, tradition, and hope—ready to welcome a pastor who will help lead them into a vibrant and faithful future.
