

Key Responsibilities

1. Teaching

- Teach monthly Grade 6–8 catechism classes monthly during the school year.
 - Lead weekly youth gatherings that include biblical teaching, discussion, and fellowship, along with a larger monthly event.
 - Develop and evaluate youth ministry programs in collaboration with the Education Committee, parents, and elders.
 - Recruit, train, and support volunteer leaders.
 - Foster connections between youth and the broader church through intergenerational relationships.
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2. Worship Life

- Encourage and equip youth to actively participate in corporate worship.
 - Coordinate opportunities for youth to serve in worship (music, Scripture reading, etc.).
 - Regularly attend worship services to model engagement and build relationships.
 - Assist in planning youth-focused or regional worship gatherings.
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3. Pastoral Care

- Provide spiritual care, encouragement, and support to youth and young adults.
 - Cultivate meaningful relationships and be present in the lives of students, especially those struggling in their faith.
 - Help connect youth with mentors and ensure ongoing support during life transitions (e.g., post-high school).
 - Pray regularly for the youth of the church.
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4. Outreach & Mission

- Plan and lead mission opportunities, including one local service project annually and a larger trip every three years.
 - Engage community youth and create welcoming pathways into church life.
 - Oversee and lead outreach initiatives such as Community Corner (weekly open gym), VBS, sports camps, and the annual Church Block Party.
 - Encourage youth involvement in service opportunities within the church, including diaconal ministries.
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5. Personal & Professional Development

- Participate in professional development opportunities, including peer support networks.
- Make use of available pastoral support and human resources team.
- Observe regular rhythms of rest, including vacation time.

6. Administration & Leadership

- Collaborate regularly with the pastoral team and participate in weekly staff meetings.
- Serve on the Education Committee and support youth ministry leaders.
- Provide monthly reports to the Senior Pastor and attend council meetings as requested.
- Ensure Safe Church compliance within youth ministries.
- Participate in regular performance evaluations.

- A growing, vibrant relationship with Jesus Christ.
- Alignment with Reformed theology (as seen in our Confessions) and a passion for discipleship within the local church.
- Bachelor's Degree in Biblical Studies or Youth Work, or equivalent experience.
- Strong relational, leadership, and organizational skills.

- Excellent communication and teaching ability.
